7: Description:

Located on the east side of Livingston Road adjacent to the Maryland Airport property, the Crawford House is a one-story, three-bay, frame building with aluminum siding. The 1933 front-gable house features paired and single six-over-six-sash windows, standing seam metal roof, two interior brick chimneys, and exposed rafter tails. The centered front door is flanked by paired six-over-six sash windows. All the windows are shaded by metal awnings. The front porch is enclosed and there is a small rear ell. The rear ell is attached to a garage by a breezeway. The 1933 frame garage is covered with vinyl siding, has a standing seam metal roof, and exposed rafter tails. A small frame building is located south of the house and was apparently used as a commercial building. This circa 1935 side-gable building has single, double and triple casement windows, a large, exterior side, brick chimney, asphalt shingle roof, doors on the gable end and principal façade, and three-bay porch with metal supports. The building is covered with aluminum siding.

#8: Statement of Significance:




