The Cook property is a typical twentieth century tobacco farm. The farm complex consists of a two-story frame dwelling, tobacco barns, hay shed, corn crib, and chicken house. The dwelling was constructed in 1914 and is characterized by its cross-shaped configuration, tin sheathed gable roof, brick chimneys. The building has experienced considerable alterations including wholesale window replacement, partial porch replacement, synthetic siding, interior trim removal, plaster failure and removal. The majority of the tobacco barns and outbuildings date from the 1940s, no outbuilding predates the twentieth century. The complex does not embody any distinctive characteristics of type, period or method of construction. Tobacco farms of the same vintage with higher levels of integrity exist throughout Southern Maryland.


