The 5th District Polling House is a simple early 20th century concrete block commercial structure prominently located at the corner of Mt. Victoria and Wicomico Beach Road. This modest structure is the only documented example of an independent election place in Charles County. The polling house is associated with the village of Tompkinsville where, during the early 20th century there were two permanent sawmills, a schoolhouse, at least one storehouse and a handful of large farms. Facing southwest, the building includes a single doorway and large window on the principal elevation. The side elevations include a parapeted roof descending in three steps from front to rear. The property is part of a wider farm known as "Plainfield" that consisted of approximately 300 acres at the time the building was erected.

The 5th District Polling House is the only documented example of an election house in Charles County. The polling house is associated with the village of Tompkinsville where during the early 20th century there were two permanent sawmills, a schoolhouse, at least one storehouse and a handful of large farms. Bordering the site is Mt. Victoria (CH-35) the home and progressive farm of lawyer and lobbyist Robert Crain. While currently little is known about the site's development, the surrounding farm, known as Plainfield, was owned by the Frere family during the first part of the 20th century. After the death of William Frere, the property descended to his widow Josephine and children Francis Marie, Margaret and John. By 1940, the property was foreclosed upon and purchased by James Mortimer Hill. It remained in the possession of the Hill family until 1967.
