Erected in the second quarter of the 20th century, the Maryland Tobacco Grower's Association Building is significant in its association with the tobacco industry in Charles County as well as the development of the railroad village of Waldorf. Although its original use is not known, according to a local resident the structure once served as an agricultural supply store for area farmers. The building, now demolished, was a simple commercial structure constructed during the second quarter of the 20th century. It consisted of a one-story front-gable molded concrete block structure with a brick pedimented false-front. The site stands just south of the Baltimore and Potomac railroad tracks. The original structure had a metal roof and a rear brick chimney flue.

The Maryland Tobacco Growers Association Building was demolished shortly after being surveyed. This simple commercial structure is believed to have been constructed during the second quarter of the 20th century and consisted of a one-story front-gable molded concrete block structure with a brick pedimented false front. The site stands just south of the Baltimore and Potomac railroad tracks. The front elevation included one centered door flanked by two large plate glass windows while the north elevation included four windows blocked in with simple concrete blocks. The south elevation included asymmetrical fenestration in the form of two windows and a contemporary door replacing an earlier window. The original structure had a metal roof and a rear brick chimney flue. The rear of the structure had been extended at least twice.

Erected in the second quarter of the 20th century, the Maryland Tobacco Growers Association Building is significant in its association with the tobacco industry in Charles County as well as the development of the railroad village of Waldorf. Although its original use is not known according to a local resident the structure once served as an agricultural supply store for area farmers.

Waldorf was first established in 1872 as a stop along the Baltimore and Potomac Railroad line. Originally known as Beantown Station for the nearby community of Beantown, after 1880 the railroad village was renamed Waldorf. The village grew quickly and in less than ten years after its establishment Waldorf supported two general stores, a restaurant and a hotel. The village also boasted a few necessary tradesmen including an undertaker, painter and blacksmith. In that year, the total population was 57. Initial development was clustered at the intersection of the railroad tracks and Leonardtown Road. The railroad became the principle means of transporting tobacco to the markets at Baltimore and Washington. Conversely, agricultural products and farm machinery arrived exclusively by rail until after World War II.
