Started in 1937 by the Sister's of Charity of Nazareth, Camp Maria was initially an all girl's camp built on the eastern shore of Breton Bay near Leonardtown, Maryland. Placing a high priority on the education of Catholic girls, the Sister's of Charity were a keystone of Catholic education in St. Mary's County as they erected schools from St. Michael's in Ridge to St. Mary's Academy in Leonardtown. Camp Maria was yet another component of Catholic education in the mid-twentieth century. The camp provided a recreational atmosphere that supplemented traditional academic curriculums. Camp buildings include several small one story, frame cabins with shuttered openings, basketball courts, a pool, and several administrative/recreational buildings. The camp is presently used as a site for retreats for many of the county's Catholic elementary schools as well as St. Mary's Ryken High School.

Camp Maria is located on the eastern shore of Breton Bay near Leonardtown, Maryland. Located on a flat 10.03 acre parcel, the camp is approached via Camp Maria Road that extends westward from Breton Beach Road. The interior network of the camp consists of approximately 10 cabins surrounded by a circular, tree lined drive. On the outside of the drive are several administrative and recreational buildings and two dwellings. Other resources include basketball courts and a pool. The property is bounded by a gravel mining operation to the north and east, residential lots to the south, and Breton Bay to the west.

The frame, one story cabins represent the most conspicuous element of Camp Maria. Although started in 1937, it is unclear whether the camp's cabins were erected at that time. The cabins were built on concrete piers and are clad with asbestos shingles. The cornice has been left open and the roofs are sheathed with corrugated metal roofs. Fenestration of these buildings consist of long horizontal windows covered with wooden shutters that can be propped open.

Other buildings at the camp were not documented.

ROAD CLASSIFICATION


