Based on the information provided by MTA, the former Abingdon Fire Station property located at MD 7 and Abingdon Road in Harford County, is not eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places. This opinion was confirmed for MTA by Christopher Weeks, Harford County Preservation Planner. The brick building was originally constructed in the 1920s but since then has been subject to a series of additions and alterations. It appears to retain little sense of the original 1920s building, or indeed any sense of an historic building. Thus, it lacks sufficient integrity for inclusion under any of the criteria. Moreover, it is not known to have any association with significant events or people. Lastly, it is not located in area which would constitute an historic district.







VIEW NORTH FROM REAR OF BUILDING




