Located just north of the intersection of Jarrettsville Road and on Rt.24, the original section of Forest Hill Elementary School was constructed in 1938, designed by John B. Hamme. A one story brick building with a flat roof displays limited architectural details. Additions occurred in 1953, 1965, 1970 and 1993 and have enveloped the original building. The resulting historic square footage is minimal compared to the non-historic square footage. The integrity of the building is poor; it does not adequately convey the appearance of a 1930s school building. Therefore, I believe Forest Hill Elementary School is not eligible for the Maryland Register of Historic Properties.




