Identified as tax map 58, Parcel 497, the Hissey Farm consists of a vernacular two story frame dwelling and a frame shed. The L-shaped configuration is composed of the two story main block with two, one story linear wings. The three bay by two bay main block exhibits an exterior brick chimney that intersects the projecting eave of the gable roof. The wing attached to the main block is a long, broad, shed-roofed structure with an exterior chimney. The end wing is a square, gabled one bay by one bay configuration with an internal chimney. The building has undergone modest modifications including a modern, brick mantle, dropped ceilings and wood paneling. The small, plank tool shed with a shed roof is located behind the farmhouse. A common type/style in the county and state, the vernacular building does not embody significant characteristics of type, period or method of construction.



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
1942 USGS QUAD
