

Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*

The Trailer/Wagon Wheel restaurant is a one-story wood frame commercial building located adjacent to the Armacost Bungalow (BA-2019). The restaurant is constructed on a concrete slab foundation in an irregular plan. It measures three bays by five bays and is clad by wood shingles. The windows are 8/8 double-hung sash windows and there is an enclosed front entry porch with a shed roof. The building has a side-gabled roof and it is clad by composition roll.

The restaurant began as a road-side stand operated by Reed Henry. Joshua Armacost, the first owner of the adjacent Armacost Bungalow, sold the parcel on which the restaurant is located to Reed E. Henry, whose address was listed as "The Trailer." The restaurant, built in ca. 1950, continued to grow by additions throughout the last half of the twentieth century. The restaurant continues to serve the residents of Hereford and the surrounding community. There are no significant distinguishing features in this building and its original fabric has been changed by additions and alterations. This property appears to be not eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places.


