DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>This elegant three story brick townhouse with stone decoration contains four very definite vertical divisions which are unified under a gable roof. The rusticated stone foundation, very typical of Queen Anne architecture, supports the building and is punctuated by a square basement window on either side of the ten wide stairs which are flanked by stone rails ending with squat newells and which lead to a large recessed brownstone porch.</p> <p>The entranceway is decorated by four Corinthian columns supporting a wide sculptured stone entablature surmounted by a cornice. The windows are all double hung with one over one lights, their height lessening at each successive story. There are two square windows above the main entrance and are separated from it by a recessed rectangular decorative brick panel. These square windows are underlined by a continuous protruding sill. A flat stone lintel above the windows is surmounted by two full arched brick courses. A projecting, decorative brick belt course runs the length of the bay and is connected and bracketed by two sculptured stone scrolls. The bay window to the left gives a vertical feeling to the otherwise horizontal lines of the building and contains double, double hung windows on each floor divided by stone mullions and surmounted on the first and second floors by a single transom with flat stone lintels and capped by a pyramidal roof projecting from the main roof. The two story bow window to the right of the main entrance contains a tripartite window with transoms separated by stone mullions with flat stone belt courses which act as lintels. The bow culminated in a small balcony outlined in a small balcony outlined by a decorative wrought iron basket and underscored by a brick belt course. Double hung, double windows open to the balcony and are capped by another pyramidal roof projecting from the main roof. Two eyebrow windows above the cornice peek out from two small umbrella-like roofs which project from the steep pitched main roof.</p> <p>This building is very typical of the Baltimore interpretation of Queen Anne/Richardsonian Romanesque architecture as applied to urban dwellings.</p>




