
Notable features:

This terrace though in poor condition faces a fairly good and historical row on Lombard Street. Should be kept.

Numbers 815-817 have iron lintels; numbers 823 1/2 and 827 have been formstoned.

Environmental context:

Lots 33-40 have been cleared for the Boulevard. Houses are vacant at 851, 821-823 1/2 and 833. Although these houses have heavy traffic on Lombard and will have the Boulevard directly to the east, it is important to the houses across-street that this facade be maintained.



