The two next items of corn & pork being the amount of provisions usually given by the deceased to his negroes in their possession, the appraisers were at some loss to determine whether to include them in this Inventory,

But

but deemed it advisable to state the items with the facts within their knowledge, in relation to them, that the court might decide either to retain or reject them, the corn was delivered to the negroes for their annual subsistence, with respect to the pork, the hogs were chiefly bought by the negroes from their own money, acquired by the sale of potatoes & poultry with the approbation of the deceased and fed from the stock of corn assigned them in part and part from an allowance made them by the deceased and in some instances when the supply obtained by the people failed, it was the habit with the deceased to furnish them.
