Registration

Lectures

Lecture 1: "Grow Your Family Tree" by Debra A. Hoffman

Lecture Summary: Discover your ancestors! Basic genealogy research steps will be covered as well as an overview of national, regional, and local resources including useful Internet sites with specific emphasis on the resources at the Maryland State Archives. Suitable for a beginner audience.

Lecture 2: "From Family Research to Lasting Treasures" by Lyndra Pratt Marshall

Lecture Summary: Have you ever wondered what to do with all of the documents, government records, photographs, artifacts, heirlooms, etc. that you acquire while tracing your family roots? Don't bury them. They should be transparent! Presenter Lyndra Marshall (née Pratt), Chair of the Maryland Commission on African American History and Culture and Owner of GENE-ALL-OF-US, INC. Family Heritage Research and Resource Center, will discuss ideas and tips you can explore to turn your research into lasting family treasures for everyone's enlightenment and enjoyment.
