



### AN OLD MAN IN HIS WINTER CLOTHES

**T**HE old men of Pomeiock cover themselves with large skins that hang down below the knees and are tied on one shoulder, leaving the other arm free. The skins are dressed without removing the fur, and lined with other skins. The younger men do not allow hair to grow upon their faces, they pluck it out as soon as it comes in; but when they get older, they let their beards grow, which are very thin. They wear their hair in a knot at the back and cut in a crest in front, as the others do.
