4 July

That the King of Potomack his two Sons & by  
Some of the Sasquahanough Indians delivered  
up Prisoners to Major Samuell Galesmyth w<sup>th</sup> full  
Consent of the said Indians witnesses the said  
Coastahanda Harigwora and Godewingue rackqua  
have sett to their hands this 29<sup>th</sup> day of  
June Ann. 1666

Further ordered that the Provinciall Court  
County Court of St Marys County, be held  
togeth<sup>r</sup> at St Marys 5 times in 3 years  
for the future and not otherwise (vizt.)

The first Court to be held at St Marys on the 4<sup>th</sup> day  
in the month of October, the second Court
