

the said street, which bridges shall be constructed of wood, in a substantial manner, under the direction of the Commissioners of the City, with the approbation of the Mayor.

Ditto for the improvement of Jones' Falls.

4.—And be it enacted and ordained, That there be borrowed, for the improvement of Jones's Falls, a sum which, during the present year, shall not exceed twenty five thousand dollars, to be applied towards said improvements, agreeably to such plan as the Mayor and City Council shall hereafter by ordinance adopt.

The above monies to be collected to be paid to the order of the Mayor and at least two of the Commissioners of Finance, and to be under their direction.

5.—And be it enacted and ordained, That all sums of money to be collected from any person or persons, body or bodies corporate, assessed as benefitted by the opening or extending of South (or Belvidere) street, or of Pratt street, shall be paid to the order of the Mayor and of at least two of the Commissioners of Finance, for the purpose of being applied, from time to time, to the payment of the loans effected for the opening of the said streets respectively; and the Mayor and said Commissioners of Finance, are hereby enjoined to use the best means in their power in negotiating the said loans, and making the application thereof, to save the City from any loss of interest, if practicable.

Tender of payment to be made.

6.—And be it enacted and ordained, That the Mayor be, and he is hereby, authorized and requested, to tender in payment the sums of monies respectively awarded to and in favor of any person or body corporate, to the persons or bodies corporate severally entitled to receive the same, within the time prescribed by and in conformity with the acts of Assembly, severally entitled, "An act for the extension of South street, in the City of Baltimore," and "An act to provide for the opening and extension of Pratt street, in the City of Baltimore."

An ordinance to extend the provisions of an ordinance therein mentioned.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That all the provisions of an ordinance entitled, "A further additional supplement to the ordinance, entitled an ordinance to prevent nuisances, and to enforce useful regulations within the City of Baltimore," approved April 3d, 1818, which are not locally inapplicable, be and the same is hereby declared to extend to the following limits, that is to say, bounded on the north by Duke street, on the west by Albermarle street, on the south by Prince street, and on the east by Exeter street. The Commissioners of the City of Baltimore are hereby specially directed to have the provisions of this ordinance strictly observed.

Extension of the provisions of an ordinance to prevent nuisances, &c.

No. 16.

An ordinance to provide for the division of the City of Baltimore into twelve wards.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That from and after the thirtieth day of September next, the City of Baltimore shall be divided into twelve wards, bounded and described as follows: that is to say,

City divided into twelve wards, with their several limits.

The first ward to comprise all that part of the city eastward of Market street (Fell's Point) to the limits of the city.

The second ward to comprise all that part of the city westward from Market street aforesaid to Harford street, and the Baltimore and Harford Turnpike road.

The third ward to comprise all that part of the city westward from Harford street, and the Baltimore and Harford Turnpike Road aforesaid, to Granby street, and High street to the intersection of Bridge street and Bridge street continued, and the Baltimore and Harford Turnpike Road, to the intersection of Harford street aforesaid.

The fourth ward to comprise all that part of the city westward and northward from the limits last aforesaid and Jones' Falls, to the north boundary line of the city, thence with said line to the Baltimore and Harford Turnpike Road, and with said road to the intersection of Harford street aforesaid.

The fifth ward to comprise all that part of the city from Jones' Falls westward to Gay street.

The sixth ward to comprise all that part of the city westward from Gay street and Jones' Falls to Calvert street.

The seventh ward to comprise all that part of the city westward from Calvert street and Jones' Fall, to Charles street, as low down as the intersection of Wine alley, thence with Wine alley in its several directions to Light street, down Light to Pratt street and with said street (or basin) to Calvert street aforesaid.

The eighth ward to comprise all that part of the city southwardly from the intersection of Charles street and Wine alley aforesaid, to Barre street, up Barre street to Goodman street, thence with Goodman street to Ridgely's cove, thence with the meanders of the water, including Fort M'Henry and

Whetstone Point, to the head of the basin, along the head of said basin to Pratt street, thence up Light street to the intersection of Wine alley, and with said alley in its several directions to Charles street, the place of beginning.

The ninth ward to comprise all that part of the city westward of Goodman street and Charles street connected with Barre street, to the intersection of Conewago street, along Conewago street to Vulcan avenue, down said avenue to Chatham street, up Chatham street to McClellan's alley, down said alley to Baltimore street, up Baltimore street to Sharp street, thence with Sharp street to Timber Neck lane, to Chesnut street (Ridgely's addition) and with said street to Ridgely's cove.

The tenth ward to comprise all that part of the city westward from the limits aforesaid of the ninth ward, and Charles street to Jones' Falls, with said Falls to the northern or boundary line of the city, along said line to the Falls turnpike road, and with the said road to Bolton street, thence to Howard street, and down Howard street to Paca street, (Ridgely's addition) thence to Ridgely's cove.

The eleventh ward to comprise all that part of the city westwardly from the limits aforesaid to the following streets: viz., John street (from its intersection with Ridgely's cove,) Eutaw street, Pratt street, Paca street and Ross street, to the northern limits of the city.

The twelfth ward to comprise all that part of the city westwardly from the limits last aforesaid, to the northern and westerly limits of the city.
