Mr. Robert W. Coleman, in conceiving and compiling the first Colored Business Directory, performed a service of incalculable value to all the people, not only of this city and state but of the country. As far as I have been able to ascertain there was no such systematic collection anywhere in the United States, prior to his inauguration of it in Baltimore, although since then the idea has been extensively copied throughout the Union.

As a result of not having such a record, when we wished to address the colored business community, it was essential to go through all sorts of round about ways to secure their names. In southern communities the usual method was to plod through several thousand pages of a city directory, selecting the names preceded by a star. This was often inaccurate and unsatisfactory, as I know personally scores of colored people whose names were not as marked, due to the fact that a light skinned person would answer the queries of the solicitor, or because the house was perhaps too nice looking for a colored tenant (in the judgment of the same men) or because it seemed too busy a place, or too large a corporation for a person of color. Mr. Coleman by collecting these names into a compact little volume has saved time which cannot be estimated.

His rewards have not, of course, been commensurate with the good he has accomplished.

Before closing I want to pay a tribute to the wonderful disposition of the compiler of this volume. If there is any person in the world whose disposition I envy, it is "Bob" Coleman's.

A young, active man, interested in social, business and political activities, is suddenly stricken almost blind. A wife, six (6) beautiful children (and they girls) to care for, a man would almost feel justified in giving way to despair. Not so Mr. Coleman. He has never stopped to realize he is not like other men. With renewed vigor, undaunted he set out, found new avenues of profit, has gotten his girls to the point where one has graduated, has maintained his home, kept up his cheerful, optimistic disposition and has constantly climbed the rounds of the ladder of success. His life is an inspiration to us all, who when much more minor troubles assail us, are ready to throw up our hands in surrender. He deserves, if anyone does, the general support of all.

OUR SCHOOLS

There came to the Baltimore teachers at the beginning of 1921 an equal salary scale for all teachers doing the same character of work regardless of race or sex. This action wipes out a long practice of discrimination in salaries against the teachers in our high and training schools, and against women.

This salary scale is not the last word, for the granted increase of from 20 to 30 per cent does not make a living salary. The Board of School Commissioners and the Board of Estimates will find it good business policy to give the teachers of our youth a living wage.

Another hopeful outlook for better schools and school conditions is the projected loan for the erection of new school houses and for the repair of the old. Among the new buildings is to be a colored high school.

The whole educational situation as it relates to our colored schools is waiting the opening up of a commodious building that will keep in school the boys and girls who drop out of the elementary schools in such large numbers. With the new building as a stimulus the elementary schools should send from 400 to 600 pupils to the high school annually instead of the 250 to 275 now yearly promoted.

With a new building the splendid work now being done by Principa^l Hawkins and his very efficient faculty will make the show it deserves.

The Colored Training School under Professor Lockerman is steadily turning out well-trained teachers for our elementary schools.

Sympathetic co-operation on the part of the people at large will contribute to our educational progress.

Morgan College is steadily growing and with its enlarged faculty and larger building facilities will also add much to our progress along educational lines.

As we go to press we regret to note the changes in the Board of School Commissioners and the summary dismissal of Superintendent Koch. Mr. Koch was much more sympathetic of our educational needs than he was accredited with.

We can only hope that the changes which have been made will make for progress and not for retrogression in any respect.

We wish the new Superintendent Dr. West much success in his new work.

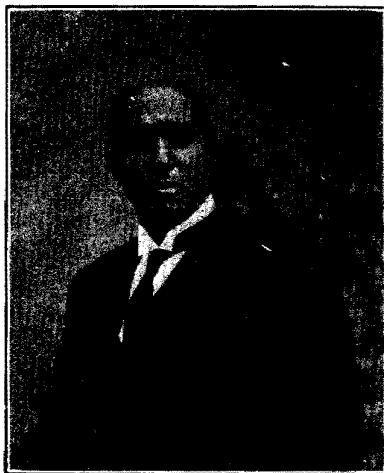

A WORD ABOUT THE FOUNDATION OF THE SCHOOL

(Extract from "Philadelphia Tribune," February 2, 1918.)

"A Splendid Example of What Courage and Energy Can Accomplish"

"Miss Minnibelle J. Derrick, the daughter of the late Bishop Derrick, and the founder of the Derrick Shorthand School, has been a resident of Philadelphia for the past few years. She graduated from Wendell Phillips High School in Chicago, and entered Oberlin College afterward, completing her work at Columbia University. The following fall term she was appointed to the Chair of French at Wilberforce University in Ohio, holding the same until the illness of her father brought her to his side. It was after his death that she decided she would not go away again to teach. In January, 1916, she decided to take a business course, but this thought was not a new one, for always she had desired work pertaining to stenography, as a business training is the door leading to almost every opportunity; but she had always been discouraged by those who wanted her to continue her classical studies and finish abroad. Therefore, she entered the 30-Day Business College with more than the average energy and determination, and applied herself to the work so that at the end of twenty-six days she was sent to her first position. At the end of sixty days she was able to repay in full her tuition.

"Colored young men and women are not welcome in the 30-Day College any more than any other business college, and this thought preyed upon Miss Derrick's mind. So it was not surprising that the President of the College was approached by her with the proposition that she be allowed to teach colored students this special system of which he held the exclusive rights. He was at first entirely out of sympathy with her, but before the call was over he had promised to think it over and asked her to call again. The next call secured the sub-contract rights to teach the system.

"The School was then started in a small room which Miss Helen Biddle loaned. It was in a building on Arch Street—American Book Company—and was the property of Miss Biddle. With a rented typewriter and desk, and no capital nor financial help from any source, Miss Derrick started her work. Later in the season she was doing so well that she removed to the Transportation Building on South Fifteenth Street. Here the large number of graduates turned out and the excellent positions secured for them brought such an overflow of applications that it was again necessary to remove, and so larger floor space was leased in the Childs Building, at Fifteenth and Chestnut Streets.

"Miss Derrick has always been proud of the fact that she had the wisdom to see the advantages of this short course. Not only time and money were saved, but a great deal of useless brain fatigue, for the methods were simple and complete.

"It is the thinking people who are endorsing the work and taking the course, through the press and from the platform everyone is strongly advised to take the course, if they are competent and in earnest, for it is not every day that such a wonderful opportunity is presented."

The School is at present located at 1435 Chestnut Street, but plans are being made for still larger and better quarters, and it is confidently expected that the students will always point with great pride to the DERRICK SHORTHAND SCHOOL

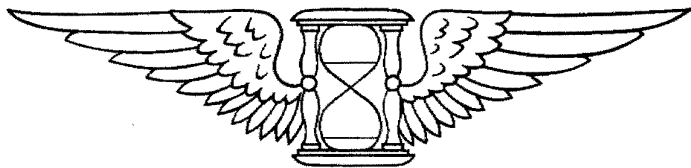

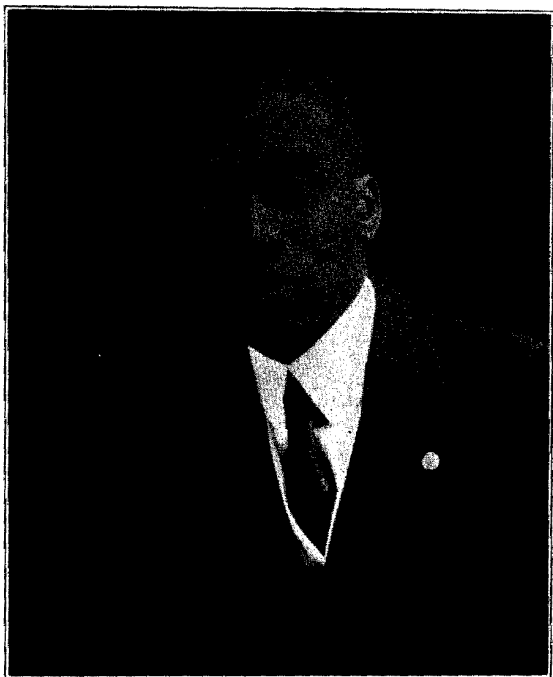
MASON A. HAWKINS

Mason Albert Hawkins has been connected with the Baltimore High School since 1901, in the positions of teacher, head of the Foreign Language Department, vice-principal and principal. Under his administration as principal the curriculum of the school has been standardized and a faculty of high efficiency maintained. Public educational meetings have been held by his teachers and students as a testimonial of his ten years' service.

Mr. Charles Grandoson Hoes, Jr., was born of slave parents at Hampdon, Baltimore County, Md., now known as Roland Park, in the year 1841. His father, Mr. Charles Grandoson Hoes, was born a slave in Charles County, where he married Miss Mary Myers of Baltimore County. Being a very ambitious man, Mr. Hoes' father, became quite a prosperous farmer and bought his freedom many years before the Civil War. He purchased a large tract of land situated on the south side of Roland Park, on a beautiful hill directly in front of the water tower. He died at his home when he was fifty-five years of age.

Much like his father, Mr. Charles Hoes, Jr., was also an ambitious man. He was married to Miss Rachel Ann Woods at old Sharp Street Church by Rev. Benjamin Brown, and he is the father of eight children: Miss Mary Hoes, deceased; Mrs. Laura V. Hawkins, deceased; Mrs. Annie E. Bishop; Miss Lulu Smith; Mrs. Clarence Johnson; Mrs. Chas. G. Hoes, third; Mr. Jessie Hoes, deceased; and Mr. Richard Hoes.

His early life was spent as a coachman for some of the best of Baltimore's aristocracy, such as Mr. J. Hall Pleasant, and Mr. C. R. O'Donnell, President of the Gas Company at that time, he was also sexton of Mt. Vernon Church at Monument and Charles Streets, which is the most wealthy congregation in Maryland. Desiring something still better than this, he went into the Furniture-Moving Business on little Monument Street near Orchard, in which he remained for fifteen years. He is an old member of Sharp Street church.

Mr. Hoes has a very interesting nephew who is Mr. Albert Peters, one of the oldest and most trustworthy employees of the American Ice Company. Mr. Peters bought a large tract of land from Mr. Hoes and on it has built one of the prettiest homes in Baltimore, colored or white.

Mr. Hoes has for a number of years retired from active business, and is living with his daughter, Mrs. Clarence Johnson, of Roland Park, in a house he built a few years ago, where frequent visitors may be seen on their beautiful front porch, and made to feel happy to behold the beautiful scenery there about. Much credit should be given to this conspicuous character as he is a self-educated man, who did not have the opportunities that are afforded today; but through thrift, economy and industry educated his children and assisted them all to begin life.

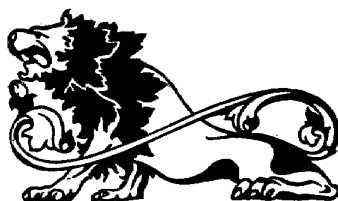

Corner Bond and Jefferson Streets, Baltimore City

Organized May 31st, 1915 by Rev. C. Ed. Browne

The congregation purchased the three-story brick building, corner Orleans and Ann Streets, where services were held until March, 1919, when the present Church property, corner Bond and Jefferson Streets, with parsonage adjoining, was secured from the Jefferson Street M. E. Congregation (white) at the cost of fifteen thousand seven hundred dollars (\$15,700). Mr. Harry O. Wilson, Banker, accepted a mortgage for eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000), which was lifted June, 1920, thus liquidating the entire indebtedness within fifteen months.

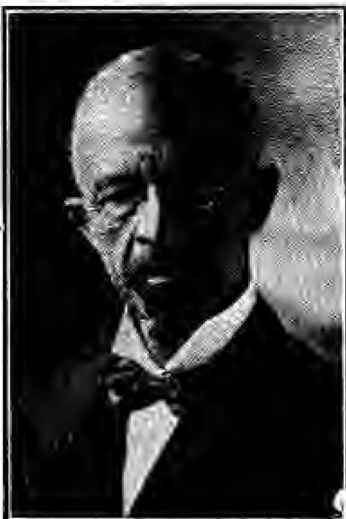

Biography of the Life of Rev. Reuben Hanson Armstrong, D.D.

Rev. Reuben Hanson Armstrong, D.D., was born Drumore township, Lancaster County, Pa., November 28, 1854. Educated in the public schools and Lincoln University, Chester Co., Pa., graduating from the Collegiate Department in 1877 and from the Seminary in 1880. He has served in the following fields: Lynchburg, Va., 1880-1881, acting at the same time as principal of the Graded School of Liberty, Va. Louisburg, N. C., 1881-1885, principal of parochial and public schools during the same period. Wilmington, N. C., 1885-1886, teacher also of the parochial schools. Harrisburg, Pa., October 1886 to October 1898, pastor of Capitol Street Presbyterian Church and recorder of Deeds for one year during this period. Baltimore, Md., pastor of Madison Street Presbyterian Church October 1898 to August 1904; November 1904 to November 1906, assistant to Rev. Matthew Anderson, D.D., of Berean Presbyterian Church, in the same period gathering together a mission at Germantown, Pa., 1906 to 1920. Started supply first of the Peoples' Mission and Pastor of Faith Presbyterian Church from the organization of the Mission into a Church October 1, 1914. The members and friends of Faith Presbyterian Church have been faithful in securing a lot worth \$4,000.00 and will complete paying for it before the end of this fiscal year. They then intend to build a church which the present pastor hopes may be the climax of his service as a minister of the Gospel. This cut and brief biography appear in this Business Directory at the request of the author. Out of his grateful remembrance of the fact that during the pastorate at Madison Street Church he was led to Christ and united with the Church.



LOUIS A. CLAY

Organizer and secretary of the Twelfth Ward Republican Club, P. C. C. K. of P. No. 4, Chairman of the Welfare Committee of the Maryland Association for Colored Blind, Alumnus of Howard High School and Allen University, Columbia, S. C. An active political and civic community worker, son of the late Rev. Louis A. Clay, D.D., of the South Carolina Conference.

SHARP STREET MEMORIAL M. E. CHURCH
Incorporated in 1802 and Located on Sharp St. near Redwood St.

Prior to this the colored members of the M. E. Church worshiped in the gallery of the Lovely Lane Chapel (German, now Redwood Street), and numbered about one-third of the denomination in and about Baltimore.

Thirteen of these members, in search of Liberty, were among the pioneer settlers of Liberia, Africa.

Between the years 1820 and 1835 seventy-two gained their freedom by escaping to Canada.

The records also show that fifty-one members were sold out of the State into Virginia, Mississippi, Georgia and Alabama.

In the hall of this church, many of the leaders of the race, both ministerial and lay, received their training under one Daniel Coker, under whom a number withdrew from Sharp Street and organized "Bethel" A.M.E. Church in 1811. Here also the Washington Annual Conference was organized in 1863.

The present Memorial building was erected at the corner of Dolphin and Etting Streets in 1898. Value \$100,000 and out of debt.

He has twice represented his conference in the law-making body of the church, and is rated as one of its very efficient and constructive legislators.

Dr. Naylor's administration at Sharp Street has been eminently successful, during which \$100,000.00 has been raised for all purposes, and a debt of \$27,000.00 discharged, leaving the church entirely free of all indebtedness. He is widely known and enjoys the esteem of his great church and the public generally. He is alive to all public interests and can be depended upon as a safe and progressive representative of his race.

He is now engaged in developing a great Community Center in connection with his church, which will cost approximately \$50,000.00.

REV. FREDERICK DOUGLAS

Pastor of Bethel Church,

Corner Druid Hill Avenue and Lanvale Street
Baltimore, Md.



Born in Edwardsville, Ill., February 19, 1872. Was educated in the public schools of Edwardsville, graduating from the high schools of Edwardsville in 1887; became a teacher in the public schools, and later moved to Southern Illinois and was made principal of the Schools of Hodges Park, where he served for eleven years. He was also Principal of the Public Schools of Carrier-Mills, Ill., and the first principal of the Colored High School of Marion, Ill. For twenty-five years he has been actively engaged in School work in his native State.

He has also been in the Ministry fourteen years, his first appointment being at Edith-Chapel, where he rebuilt the Church and paid it out of debt.

He was then appointed to the Pastorate at Harrisburg, Ill., where he remodeled the church and paid the entire debt.

While stationed at Harrisburg, Carrier-Mills, a thriving little mining town, was attached, and Rev. Douglas built here a beautiful stone church, purchased two beautiful lots and paid the entire cost of property and building.

After four successful years at Harrisburg, during which time the church was taken out of the missionary list and made one of the best charges in the District, he was appointed to the Pastorate of Marion, Ill., a circuit comprising Marion and Dew-Maine. Here during his four years' service he built two churches and a splendid parsonage; purchased two additional lots for the Marion people, and not only paid the entire debt but also paid the Marion church out of the building and loan—an obligation of \$800.

He was then assigned to the historic Ward's-Chapel at Cairo, Ill., the best charge in the Illinois annual Conference, and the head of the Cairo Presiding Elder District.

Here he remodeled the church and parsonage at a cost of \$2,500, and paid for the same. Was elected to the Secretaryship of Wilberforce University; but declined to accept the position, believing the Divine Call to the Ministry of greater importance than any other calling in the world.

In November 1917 the beautiful church at Cairo was destroyed by fire, and the following March work was begun on the present magnificent \$50,000 structure, which was completed just a few months prior to Rev. Douglas' appointment to Bethel this City.

It may be of interest to say that he laid the foundation for the new Ward Chapel at Cairo, March 25, 1918, and completed the building worth \$50,000 leaving only \$5,900 to be paid on the entire indebtedness by his successor.

Rev. Douglas has launched a great financial campaign to free Bethel of her \$12,000 burden, and plans to give the connection its most beautiful church free from debt by November 22.

Rev. James R. L. Diggs, A.B., Ph.D., became pastor of Trinity Baptist Church, September 1, 1914. The church was then on 20th Street near Charles. In 1915 the new property at Druid Hill Avenue and Roberts Street, was purchased, paid for and used until sold, February 5, 1920. The present edifice was bought and occupied May 2, 1920. It is worth perhaps \$75,000. See Cut.

The pastor was prepared for college at Wayland Seminary, Wash., D. C., completed the college course at Bucknell University, Lewisburg, Pa., in with the degree of Bachelor of Arts in 1898, and Master of Arts in 1899 for a year's extra work. In 1906 he earned the degree of Doctor of Philosophy on the basis of work done at Bucknell, Cornell and the Illinois Wesleyan University. For further notice see "Who is Who in America," 1908-1909.

In 1901 Professor Diggs was married to Miss A berta M. Pack, a cultured woman and teacher in the schools of Hinton, W. Va. She earned her degrees of A. B., and A. M., for four and two years work respectively, at Selma University, where she was professor of German and History, 1913-1914.

She is a graduate of the college preparatory course of Virginia Union University, Richmond, Va., where she prepared for college. She is popular in Baltimore as a public speaker.
