Senator France's Record

1. Senator France fought the Poe Amendment that would have disfranchised the colored voter through the Grandfather's Clause.
2. Senator France called a conference upon Educational and Health Topics, particularly in the interest of the colored people.
3. Senator France in the United States Senate has made urgent pleas for better educational opportunities for the colored people.
4. Senator France advocated creation of a Department of Health co-ordinate with the other Departments of Government which would insure the best hygienic and sanitary conditions for colored along with all other citizens.
5. Senator France advocated amendment of the Railroad Bill so that colored people paying a first class fare should have first class accommodations.
6. Senator France introduced anti-lynching bill and made a fight for the passage of the Dyer ANTI-LYNCHING bill.
7. Senator France in the distribution of patronage has always shown generous consideration for the claims of colored citizens.
8. Senator France urged upon the President of the United States full recognition of colored Republicans in the distribution of patronage.
9. Senator France urged that the Government of the United States should make a liberal loan to the Republic of Liberia.
10. Senator France introduced a resolution for a Commission to be sent to the Liberian Republic to convey friendly messages for the promotion of more cordial understanding and better working relations between the small colored Republic and the big white one.

One of the great differences between modern civilization and the ages that have gone before is to be noted in the use by many men of information compiled and published by one of their number. It is impossible to make even an approximate estimate of the time and energy saved to the human race by the application of such a process in modern life. Little by little men have learned the value of organization and co-operation, and have understood how to make use of the labors of their fellows, and today the extent to which this is done in any group or community is an accurate index of the state of advancement of that group.

For a long time after the Civil War, the colored people in this country were "hewers of wood and drawers of water," and their business and industrial life was of the simplest kind. As the years passed slight changes were noted, and in very recent years the change has been most rapid, especially in the great urban centers. One of the recognized accompaniments of modern commercial and professional life and organization is the directory. It is now sixty-two years ago since Bradstreet first published his famous commercial directory in New York. Nine years ago the publisher of this work thought he saw the need of a directory for the colored business, professional and educational world of Baltimore, and later included the adjacent cities of Washington, Wilmington and Annapolis. That his thought was a good one is evidenced by the fact that in the years intervening between 1913 and the current year 10 editions of this work have been published, and similar works have been compiled for other cities with large colored populations, in imitation of Mr. Coleman's idea.

One of the very interesting things about this directory is its compiler, himself well known in the three cities which figure in its pages. Mr. Robert W. Coleman, comes of good stock, being the son of Sergeant A. B. Coleman, who, associated with the younger Frederick Douglass, helped to organize the colored regiments in Massachusetts during the dark days of the Civil War, and for this service received the thanks of the legislature. He is a brother of Mr. John H. Coleman, a prominent business man of Chicago, and a cousin of Judge Robt. H. Terrell, of the Municipal Court, Washington, D. C.

Stricken, after he reached adult manhood, with almost complete blindness, Mr. Coleman, though weighed down by the responsibility for the care of large family, showed the stuff that was in him by learning a new trade, that of piano-tuning, and in his odd hours, at certain seasons of the year, collecting the advertising and other material for his directory in the four cities concerned. His energy, courage and perseverance, under such a handicap, have been little short of marvelous. Mr. Coleman is a graduate of the Business Department of M Street High School, Washington.

The directory idea, in this new age of progress and expansion among the colored people, is capable of almost indefinite extension, and its possibilities are unlimited. It is our hope that the originator of the idea may some day realize his most ambitious dreams concerning it. With the assistance of and co-operation of the communities involved, not only in the way of advertising, but also in the furnishing of complete and accurate information, there is no reason why he should not do this, for the enterprise is certainly deserving of the most hearty and generous support of the public.



MISS MARY VIRGINIA BURRELL

Miss Mary Virginia Burrell, the daughter of Madam Jennie Creditt Jones and the late M. H. Burrell, is a Baltimorean by birth. She is a graduate of School No. 103, 1917, and of the Baltimore High School, 1920, completing the course in three and one-half years.

Miss Burrell in 1921 entered Howard University, Washington, D. C., where she is pursuing a seven-year combination medical course. She desires to specialize in women's and children's diseases in Germany for one year, after receiving her medicine course at Howard. Since Miss Burrell has been at Howard she has served as captain of the girls' debating team of her class and as class representative to the Students' Council. She is an active member of the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority.



JOHN HENRY MURPHY

Publisher and editor of the Baltimore Afro-American for twenty-six years, who died at his McCulloh street home following a brief illness, April 4th, 1922, at the age of eighty-one.

Mr. Murphy was dean of colored newspaper men, and the first to establish an independent weekly. In early life he was a whitewasher, at fifty-five he was broke, and with his wife's aid entered the newspaper business. He developed the Afro-American until it is the largest newspaper in the East, with the best equipped plant owned and operated by colored people in the United States.

Since taking up her residence in Washington she has been quite actively identified with the educational and social life of the Capital City. She has taught in Washington schools and is at present assistant librarian at the Dunbar High School. She is a member of a number of women's clubs.



EMMET J. SCOTT

Emmet Scott, secretary-treasurer of Howard University and formerly private secretary to the late Booker T. Washington. He was assistant secretary to the Secretary of War during the World War, and rendered high service to his country and to his race.

ROBERT H. TERRELL

Robert H. Terrell, judge of the Municipal Court in Washington, D. C., and the only colored officeholder who did not lose his position under President Wilson.



W. ASHBIE HAWKINS

W. Ashbie Hawkins, of the law firm of Hawkins & McMechen, one of the leading lawyers of the city and head of the Knights of Pythias, Eastern and Western Hemispheres. Mr. Hawkins is a bold, fearless speaker, and won country-wide notice through his running as a candidate for the United States Senate on an independent ticket several years ago.



REV. DR. ERNEST LYON

Rev. Dr. Ernest Lyon, former pastor of John Wesley M. E. Church, for more than 12 years, and now pastor of Ames Memorial M. E. Church, corner of Carey and Baker streets, this city, is one of the leading men of his race, capable by education, travel and experience. He was for nearly 8 years Minister Resident and Consul General of the United States to the Republic of Liberia, and now Liberian Consul General in the United States for the past 12 years. During the war period he was, by appointment of Governor Harrington, Chairman of the Colored Division of the Maryland Council of Defense, and received deserved commendation at the close of the war. He is by appointment of Mayor Broening one of the commissioners to erect the Million Dollar War Memorial in the public square in front of the City Hall.

Added to his other distinctions, at the last commencement exercises of Kittrell College the Board of Trustees unanimously voted to confer on him the honorary degree of Doctoris Divinitates, and Bishop J. Albert Johnson deputed the Rev. Dr. A. L. Gaines to present the diploma at a function held in his church in honor of the occasion. Dr. Lyon is known and recognized throughout the country as one of the foremost advocates of the race.



MISS EDITH COOPER

Miss Edith Cooper, graduate of local schools and bachelor of arts from Morgan College. She has the unusual distinction of being the first colored supervisor of elementary grades.



Dr. Georgiana R. Simpson was born in Washington, D. C. She studied at Fraulein Warendorf's Seminary for Young Women and Girls in Rostock, Germany, and in Paris and Tours Alliance Francaise. She received her Ph. D. degree from the University of Chicago, June, 1921. Dr. Simpson is a teacher of Latin, French and German at Dunbar High School. Dunbar High School is the only school in this country with two female members of its faculty with a Ph. D. degree, namely, Dr. Simpson and Dr. Dykes.



EVA BEATRICE DYKES

Eva Beatrice Dykes, one of the first three colored women to receive the degree of Ph. D., June 1921. Educated in the public schools of Washington, D. C.

A. B. "summa cum laude," Howard University, 1914. College of Arts and Sciences.

A. B. "magna cum laude," with honors in English, Radcliffe, 1917.

A. M. in English, Radcliffe College, Cambridge, Mass., 1918.

Ph. D. in English, Radcliffe, 1921. Subject of doctor's dissertation, "Pope and His Influence in America from 1715 to 1850."

While at Radcliffe received two scholarships of \$200 each, one in the under-graduate department and one in the graduate department. At present teacher of English, Dunbar High.



IDA R. CUMMINGS

Miss Ida R. Cummings is one of the women in Baltimore who has given unstinted service to her race. She received her education in the public schools of Baltimore, and is a pioneer in kindergarten work, having the distinction of being the first colored kindergarten teacher appointed in the public schools of Maryland. She is a graduate of the Baltimore Kindergarten Training School Association, and also a post-graduate. Miss Cummings has studied in the Chicago Kindergarten College and is a graduate of Morgan College, Class of 1922, and has been a successful teacher in the Baltimore public schools for a number of years.

For eighteen years Miss Cummings has been president of the Colored Fresh Air and Empty Stocking Circle, which organization has gladdened the hearts of many thousand children through the annual Christmas treat and the week's stay at the Fresh Air Farm.

At the beginning of the World War Miss Cummings was appointed by Governor Harrington as chairman of the Woman's Section Council of Defense, and the work done by the women of the state ranks among the best.

Miss Cummings is a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and in 1920 was elected as a delegate to the General Conference.

MISS FRANCES MURPHY

Miss Frances Murphy by sheer merit rose from a teacher in the grades to a teacher of theory in the Normal School. She has also taught in summer schools, at Morgan College and in the South. Her latest appointment was assistant supervisor over the primary grades.





J. LOGAN JENKINS

Mr. Jenkins, a prominent caterer of Baltimore, was born at Salisbury, N. C., and was educated at Biddle University. Later he was employed by the Chesapeake Steamboat Co. as steward, after which he entered the catering business in 1914.

He is a thirty-third degree Mason Pythian, and is a popular community and church worker. He has served as a member of the grand jury and of the Council of Defense of the late war.

Mr. Jenkins is the sole manufacturer of Velvet Brand Mayonnaise, Tartar Sauce and Fruit Salad Dressing.



LAWYER LEWIS S. FLAGG

Lawyer Lewis S. Flagg, son of Rev. Lewis S. Flagg, and one of the most prosperous young lawyers of Baltimore.

Rev. John Hurst, presiding bishop of the Florida Conference, African Methodist Episcopal Church, and resident bishop of Baltimore District.

The congregation purchased the three-story brick building, corner Orleans and Ann Streets, where services were held until March, 1919, when the present church property, corner Bond and Jefferson Streets, with parsonage adjoining, was secured from the Jefferson Street M. E. Congregation (white) at the cost of fifteen thousand seven hundred dollars (\$15,700). Mr. Harry O. Wilson, Banker, accepted a mortgage for eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000), which was lifted June, 1920, thus liquidating the entire indebtedness within fifteen months.

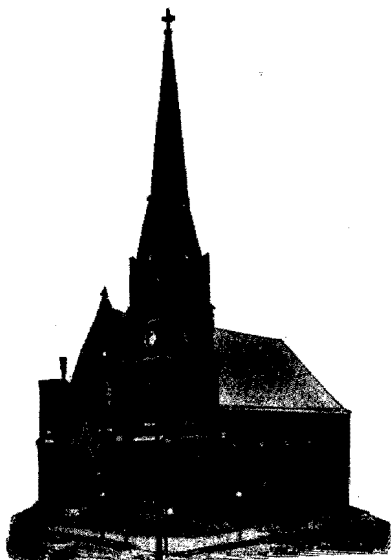
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 Charles H. Johnston, 16 Presstman St.

In 1915 the new property at Druid Hill Avenue and Roberts Street was purchased, and used until sold, February 5, 1920. The present edifice was bought and occupied May 2, 1920. It is worth perhaps \$75,000.

The pastor was prepared for college at Wayland Seminary, Washington, D. C., completed the college course at Bucknell University, Lewisburg, Pa., in with the degree of Bachelor of Arts in 1898, and Master of Arts in 1899 for a year's extra work. In 1901 Professor Diggs was married to Miss Alberta M. Pack, a cultured woman and teacher in the schools of Hinton, W. Va. She earned her degrees of A.B., and A.M. for four and two years work respectively, at Selma University, where she was professor of German and History, 1913-1914.

She is a graduate of the college preparatory course of Virginia Union University, Richmond, Va., where she prepared for college. She is popular in Baltimore as a public speaker.

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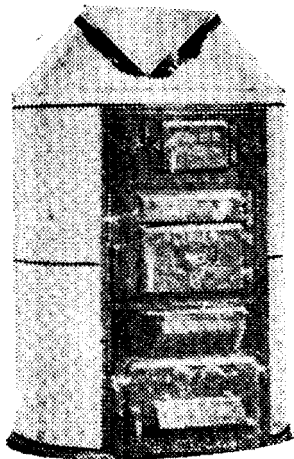
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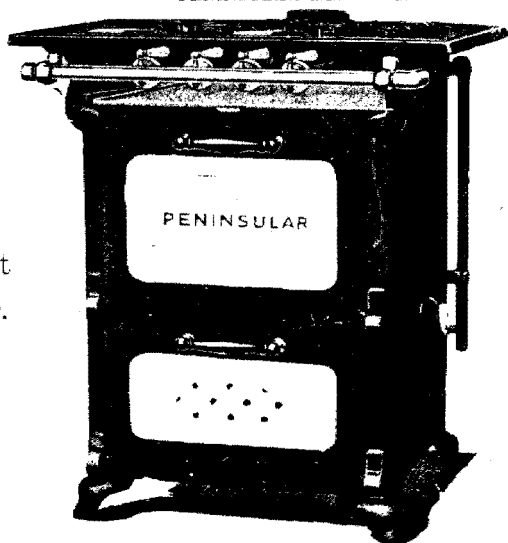
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Dr. Peter Carter Neal died on March 27, 1920, which caused great sorrow in Baltimore as well as in the Church.

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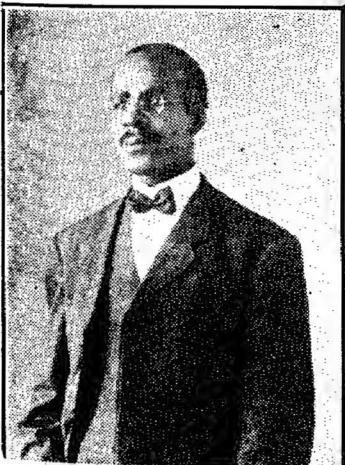
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
