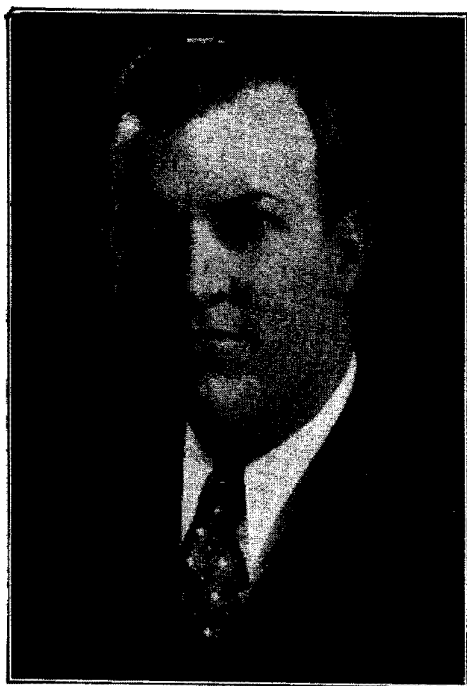

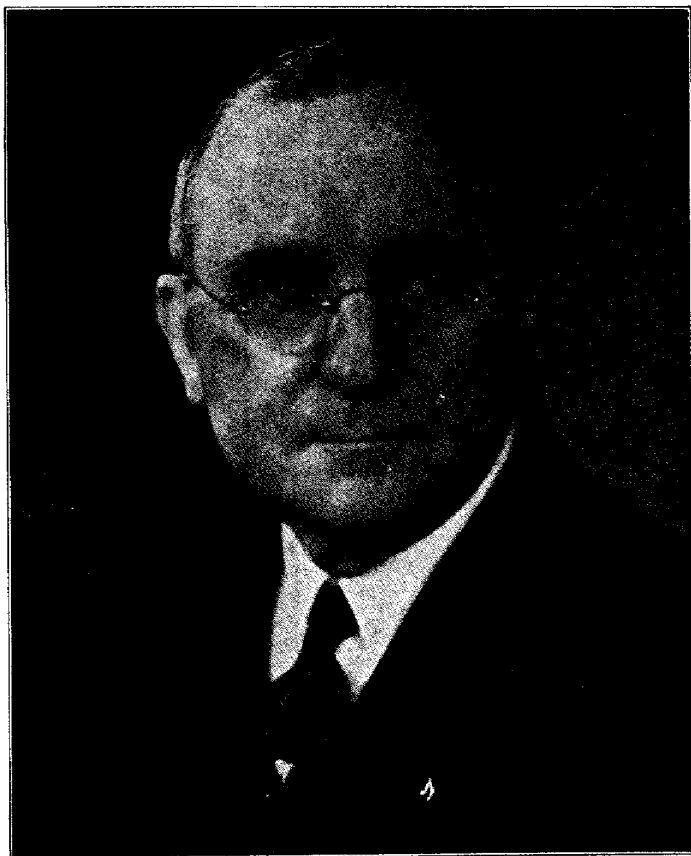

Director of Colored Schools

Elmer A. Henderson, the Director of Colored Schools is a product of the Baltimore School System. He is a graduate of Morgan State College.

Mr. Henderson has done graduate work at the University of Pennsylvania. He is also a member of the Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity. The Director has served as president of the Association of Administrators and Supervisors in the Colored Schools of Baltimore and as Vice President of the City Wide Colored Teachers' Association. He has contributed interesting articles to Religious and Educational Magazines.

Aside from being an educator, Mr. Henderson is also a churchman. He has always been interested in Church School work and at present he is conference superintendent of the A. M. E. Church Schools for the State of Maryland and the District of Columbia.

The Director became an elementary teacher in the city of Baltimore in 1906 at the age of 19. In 1915 he was appointed a critic teacher. After outstanding success in this position Mr. Henderson was appointed Vice Principal in-charge of School No. 129 and a year later he was appointed Principal of the same school. Due to the Housing Project in the city, School No. 129 has been abandoned.

Mr. Henderson has also served as Principal of Schools No. 100 and No. 101. Elementary School No. 101 is the largest elementary school in the city of Baltimore. In January 1941 he was appointed Principal of the Booker T. Washington Junior High School with an enrollment of over 2500 children. Mr. Henderson has also served as Principal of Evening Schools and Summer Schools.

This represents 37 successful years up from the ranks in the Baltimore Public School System.

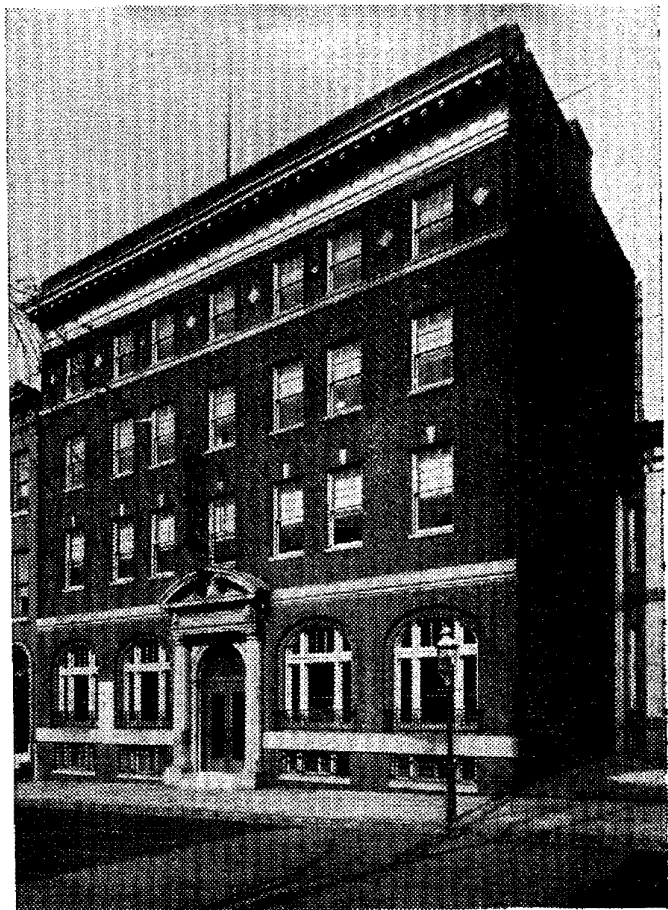

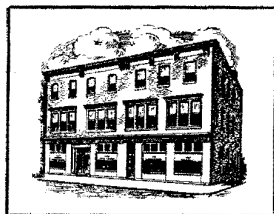

A bill providing for appointment of the trustees of Morgan State College by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate, sponsored by the State administration, was introduced in the Senate Thursday by Senator E. Milton Altfield (4th Dist., Balto.)

Under terms of the bill, in which the nine present members of the board are named, the terms would expire, one each year from now to 1952. Each of the terms however, will be for nine years.

Under original provisions made when the State took over Morgan, trustees were to be appointed by the board of public works until such time as the general assembly had worked out a permanent method of control.

To Have Full Authority

Under the terms of the new law, the board of trustees will be given full authority and responsibility for the conduct of affairs at the college. Members shall receive no compensation for their services.

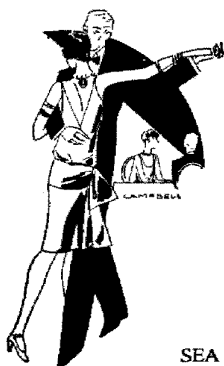

Biographies of 24 Colored Men Who Served in the U. S. Congress

JAMES THOMAS RAPIER (1837-1883)

Born in Florence, Lauderdale County, Ala., November 13, 1837; educated in private schools in Alabama and studied in Canada. Studied law and was admitted to the bar; taught school, returned to the South and traveled as a correspondent for a Northern newspaper. He went to Florence, Ala., and became a cotton planter; appointed notary public by the governor in 1866; member of the first Republican convention held in Alabama, was one of the committee that framed the platform; member of the State Constitutional Convention at Montgomery in 1867. Unsuccessful candidate for secretary of State of Alabama in 1870.

Appointed assessor of internal revenue in 1871; named State commissioner to the Vienna Exposition in 1873 by the governor of his State; also commissioner for the U. S. at the World's Fair in Paris, France, 1878.

Elected as a Republican in 1872 to the House of Representatives in the Forty-third Congress and served from March 4, 1873, to March 3, 1875; unsuccessful candidate for re-election in 1874 to the Forty-fourth Congress.

* * *

JEFFERSON FRANKLIN LONG (1836-1900)

Congressman Long was born near Knoxville, Crawford County, Ga., March 3, 1836; received a primary education and became a merchant tailor at Macon. Mr. Long was elected to the Forty-first Congress to fill the vacancy created when the House declared Samuel F. Gove, white, not entitled to his seat.

He served from December 22, 1870, to March 3, 1871, and was not a candidate for re-election. Retiring from the House, he resumed his occupation as a tailor.

Mr. Long, second colored man elected and seated in the House, the first from Georgia, died February 5, 1900.



JOHN MERCER LANGSTON (1829-1897)

Born in Louisa, Louisa County, Va., December 14, 1829; attended the common schools in Ohio, graduated from the literary department of Oberlin College in 1849 and from the theological department in 1852. Studied law in Elyria, Ohio, assisted in recruiting colored men in the Fifty-fourth and Fifty-fifth Massachusetts Regiments during the Civil War.

Appointed inspector-general of the Bureau of Freedmen, Refugees, and Abandoned Lands in 1868. Practiced law in Washington, dean of the law department of Howard University, 1869-1876; commissioned by President Grant a member of the board of health of the District of Columbia in 1871.

Elected president of the Virginia Normal and Collegiate Institute, Petersburg, Va., in 1885. Successfully contested as a Republican the election of Edward C. Venable, white, to the Fifty-first Congress, served from September 23, 1890, to March 3, 1891; unsuccessful candidate for re-election in 1890 to the Fifty-second Congress. Died in Washington November 15, 1897.

* * *

JERE HARALSON (1846-1916)

Born in Muscogee County, Ga., April 1, 1846. A slave until emancipated in 1865; removed to Alabama; elected a member of the State legislature in 1870 and to the Alabama Senate in 1872. He was elected as a Republican to the Forty-fourth Congress March 4, 1875 and served until March 3, 1877, when he resigned. Appointed U. S. custom inspector in Baltimore in 1879, and served until his resignation in 1882.

He then removed to Louisiana, then Texas. Later he removed again to Oklahoma, then Colorado where, in the latter State, he engaged in coal mining, and in 1916 was killed by wild beasts.

HIRAM RHODES REVELS

(1827-1901)

Born in Fayetteville, Cumberland County, N. C., September 27, 1827. Attended the Quaker Seminary, Union County, Ind., and Drake County Seminary, Ohio, was graduated from Knox College Bloomington, Ill., and was ordained a minister in the AME Church at Baltimore in 1845. Accepted a pastorate in Baltimore in 1860. During the early stages of the Civil War, he assisted in organizing the first colored regiments of soldiers in Maryland to help serve the Union and served in Vicksburg, Miss., as chaplain of a colored regiment in 1864. He settled in Natchez, Miss., in 1868; elected a member of the State Senate in 1870.

Upon the readmission of the State of Mississippi to representation in the Federal Union, he was elected as Republican to the United States Senate, served from February 23, 1870, to March 3, 1871. After his retirement from the Senate, he returned to his State and was appointed secretary of State ad-interim in 1873.

Served as president of Alcorn Agricultural College, Rodney, Miss., 1876-1882. Appointed district superintendent of the AME Church at Holly Springs, Miss., 1873.

Died in Aberdeen, Miss., January 16, 1901, while attending a church conference.

JOSIAH T. WALLS

(1842-1905)

Born in Winchester Va., December 30, 1842; received a limited education there and moved to Florida where he became a farmer. A member of the Constitutional Convention of Florida in 1868; State Senator 1869-1872. Elected to the Forty-second Congress March 4, 1871; served until 1873; re-elected as a Republican to the Forty-third and Forty-fourth Congresses, served from March 4, 1873, to March 3, 1877.

Upon retirement, he engaged in a successful truck-farming business and died in Tallahassee in 1905.

BENJAMIN STERLING TURNER

(1825-1894)

Born near Weldon, Halifax County, N. C., March 17, 1825; received a primary education; adopted State: Alabama. Elected tax collector of Dallas County, Ala., in 1867 and in 1869 elected councilman of the city of Selma. Elected as a Republican to the Forty-second Congress and served from March 4, 1871 to March 3, 1873; unsuccessful candidate for re-election in 1872 for the Forty-third Congress. After his retirement from Congress he engaged in agricultural pursuits.

Died in Selma, Dallas County, Ala., March 21, 1894; interment in Live Oak cemetery. He has the distinction of being the first colored man elected to the U. S. House of Representatives from Alabama.

GEORGE HENRY WHITE

(1852-1918)

Born in Rosindale, Bladen County, N. C., December 18, 1852; attended public schools and was graduated from

Howard University, Washington in 1877. Studied law, admitted to the bar in 1879 and commenced his practice in New Bern, N. C. Was principal of N. C. State Normal School, served in the State House of Representatives in 1880; member of the State Senate, 1884; solicitor and prosecuting attorney for the Second Judicial District of North Carolina.

Elected as a Republican to the Fifty-fifth and Fifty-sixth Congresses and served from March 4, 1897, to March 3, 1901. Resumed the practice of law and also engaged in banking.

Died in Philadelphia, December 28, 1918. Interment in Eden Cemetery.

He was the last of the group of twenty-two colored men who for thirtyone years (1870-1901) kept almost continuously one of their race in halls of Congress.

He was a member present when Congress declared war on Spain, April 25, 1898.

BLANCHE K. BRUCE**(1841-1898)**

Born a slave in Prince Edward County, Va., March 1, 1841; tutored by his master's son. At the outbreak of the war



he went to Missouri where he taught school in Hannibal. He later attended Oberlin College and at the close of the war he moved to Mississippi, became the Sheriff of Bolivar County. He was a planter and a member of the Mississippi Levee Board.

Elected to the United States Senate in February, 1875, he served from March 4 of that year to March 3, 1881. Was delegated to several Republican National Conventions; appointed Register of the United States Treasury by President Garfield in May, 1881.

He was recorder of deeds of the District of Columbia from 1891 to 1893. In 1897 he was again appointed Register of the Treasury.

He died in Washington, March 17 1898.

* * *

ALONZO JACOB RANSIER**(1834-1882)**

Born in Charleston, S. C., January 3, 1834; received a limited education; employed as a shipping clerk in 1850.



Member of a convention of the Friends of Equal Rights at Charleston in 1865 and was deputized to present a memorial to the Congress of the United States.

Elected a member of the State Constitutional Convention in 1868 and 1869; elected Presidential elector from his State for Ulysses S. Grant

for President and Schuyler Colfax for Vice President.

He was elected lieutenant-governor of South Carolina in 1870; president of the Southern States' convention of colored men at Columbia in 1871.

In 1872 he was elected as a Republican to the Forty-third Congress, and served from March 4, 1873, to March 3, 1875.

After his retirement from Congress, he served as United States Internal Revenue collector for the Second District of South Carolina, 1875 to 1876, after which he resigned. Died in Charleston August 17, 1882.

ROBERT BROWN ELLIOTT**(1842-1884)**

Born in Boston, Mass., August 11, 1842; attended High Hollow Academy, London, England, in 1853, and was



graduated from Eton College, England, in 1859. Studied law, was admitted to the bar and practiced in Columbia, S. C. He served as a Republican in the State House of Representatives from July 6, 1868, to October 23, 1870; assistant adjutant general of South Carolina, 1869-1871; elected as a

Republican to the Forty-second and Forty-third Congresses and served from March 4, 1871 until his resignation November 1, 1874.

Again elected a member of the State House of Representatives, 1847-1876, served as speaker; unsuccessful candidate for election as attorney-general of South Carolina in 1876.

Appointed U. S. special agent of the treasury of Charleston, S. C. in 1881 and later at New Orleans. Resigned to open his law office and practiced until his death in New Orleans August 9, 1884.

* * *

JAMES EDWARD O'HARA**(1844-1905)**

Born in New York City February 26, 1844, pursued a course of academic training; studied



law in North Carolina and at Howard University and was admitted to the North Carolina bar in 1871. Engrossing clerk in the State Constitutional Convention of North Carolina in 1869; chairman of the board of commissioners for Halifax County, 1872-1879. Elected a member of the State Constitutional

Convention in 1875; was nominated as a Republican for the Forty-sixth Congress, but was unsuccessful.

Elected as Republican to the Forty-eighth and Forty-ninth Congresses and served from March 4, 1883 to March 3, 1887; unsuccessful candidate for re-election in 1886. Resumed the practice of law in New Bern, N. C., and died there September 11, 1905.

He was one of the few colored men who served in the first Democratic administration under President Grover Cleveland.

RICHARD HARVEY CAIN

(1825-1887)

Born in Greenbrier County, Va., April 12, 1825; removed with his father to Gallipolis, Ohio, in 1831, and attended school. Entered the ministry and was



pastor in Brooklyn, N. Y., from 1861-1865; moved to South Carolina in 1865 and settled in Charleston. Was elected delegate to the Constitutional Convention of South Carolina in 1868; member of the State Senate 1868-1872; manager and editor of the Charleston Leader.

Elected as a Republican to the Forty-third Congress in 1872 and served from March 4, 1873, to March 3, 1879; was not a candidate for re-election in 1878.

Returned to the ministry after retirement from Congress, was elected bishop of the African Methodist Episcopal Church in 1880 and served until his death in Washington, D. C., January 18, 1887.

THOMAS MILLER

(1849-1937)

Born in Ferrebeeveville, Beaufort County, S. C., June 17, 1849; attended the public schools in Charleston, S. C. and



Hudson, N. Y., was graduated from Lincoln University, Chester County, Pa., in 1872. School commissioner of Beaufort in 1872; studied law; admitted to the bar in 1875 and practiced in Beaufort. He was a member of the State executive committee, 1878-1880; elected a member of the State Senate in

1880. He successfully contested the election of William Elliott (white) to the Fifty-first Congress and served from September 24, 1890, to March 3, 1891.

He was an unsuccessful candidate for re-election in 1890 to the Fifty-second Congress, elected a member of the State Constitutional Convention in 1895.

Elected president of the State Colored College in Orangeburg, S. C., and served from 1896 to 1911, when he retired.

He died in Charleston, S. C., in 1937, after a year of total blindness.

JOHN ROY LYNCH

(1847-1939)

Born near Vadalisa, Concordia Parish, La., September 10, 1847. When he was a child his parents moved to Natchez,



Miss., where he attended evening schools and was tutored by private instructors. Hungry for education, he read the best works published at the time on ancient and modern literature. Elected to the Mississippi House of Representatives, he served from 1869-1871; re-elected and served from 1872-73. In the latter term he served as speaker of the House.

Elected as a Republican to the Forty-third and Forty-fourth Congresses and served from March 4, 1873 to March 3, 1877.

Unsuccessful candidate for re-election in 1876 to the Forty-fifth Congress; successfully contested the election of James R. Chalmer (white) to the Forty-seventh Congress and served from April 29, 1882, to March 3, 1883; unsuccessful candidate for re-election in 1882 to the Forty-eighth Congress; returned to his plantation in Adams County, Miss., and engaged in agriculture.

* * *

ROBERT SMALLS

(1839-1915)

Born in Beaufort, S. C., April 15, 1839. Self-educated, he moved in 1851 to Charleston, where he became a rigger and



worked on the Charleston transport, Planter. On May 13, 1862, he seized the Planter, which then was General Ripley's Confederate dispatch boat, took it from wharf in Charleston harbor past the rebel battery at Fort Sumter. With the aid of eight colored comrades, he delivered the boat to the

blockading Union fleet.

For this act of heroism he was named captain in the U. S. Navy in December, 1863; piloted the monitor, Keokuk in the attack on Fort Sumter, April 7, 1863; later was placed in charge of the Light House Inlet and commanded the Planter which he brought to Baltimore in September, 1886.

ROBERT C. DE LARGE
(1842-1874)

Born in Aiken, S. C., March 15, 1842; attended the common schools and Wood



High School in Aiken, from which he was graduated. Engaged in agricultural pursuits; elected delegate to the State Constitutional Convention in 1868; member of the State House of Representatives, 1868-1870; was one of the State commissioners of the sinking fund.

Elected State land commissioner in 1870 and served until elected to Congress; presented his credentials as a Republican member-elect to the Forty-second Congress and served from March 4, 1871, until January 24, 1873, when the seat was declared vacant, election having been contested by Christopher C. Bowen, white.

After his retirement from Congress, he was local magistrate in Charleston, S. C., until his death there February 14, 1874.

* * *

HENRY P. CHEATHAM
(1857-1935)

Born near Henderson, Granville (now Vance) County, N. C., December 27, 1857.



Attended the public schools and was graduated from Shaw University, Raleigh, N. C., in 1883; principal of State Normal School at Plymouth, N. C., 1883-1884; register of deeds of Vance County, 1884-1888; studied law, but did not practice.

Elected as a Republican to the Fifty-first and Fifty-second Congress and served from March 4, 1889, to March 3, 1893; unsuccessful candidate for re-election in 1892 to the Fifty-third Congress. In 1897, President McKinley appointed him recorder of deeds for the District of Columbia; served from 1897-1901, when he resigned.

Moved to Oxford, N. C., in 1907; became superintendent of the North Carolina Orphanage at Oxford, which he helped to found in 1887; elected president of the Negro Association of North Carolina.

Died October 29, 1935.

JOHN ADAMS HYMAN
(1840-1891)

Born near Warrenton, Warren County, N. C., July 23, 1840. When a youth he was sent to Alabama against his will;



returned to his native State after the Civil War; pursued elementary studies; entered politics in his State and was elected delegate to the State Equal Rights Convention in 1865 and a delegate to the Constitutional Convention in 1868.

Served in the State Senate, 1868-74; elected as a Republican to the Forty-fourth Congress and served from March 4, 1875, to March 1877; unsuccessful candidate for re-nomination to the Forty-fifth Congress in 1876; retired and engaged in agricultural pursuits.

Appointed U. S. special deputy collector of customs for the Fourth district of North Carolina July 1, 1877, served until June 30, 1878; resided in Washington until his death September 14, 1891; interment in Harmony cemetery.

He was the first of his race to be elected to the House of Representatives from North Carolina.

While serving his term in Congress, he was present to vote on the admission of Colorado into Statehood.

GEORGE W. MURRAY
(1853-1926)

Born near Rembert, S. C., September 22, 1853; educated in the public schools of the State and the University of South Carolina; taught school for fifteen



years; U. S. inspector of customs at the port of Charleston 1890-92. Elected as a Republican to Fifty-third Congress, served from March 3, 1893, to March 3, 1895; successfully contested the election of William Elliott, white, to the Fifty-fourth Congress, served from June 4, 1896, to March 3, 1897, after which he retired and engaged in real estate business. Moved to Chicago in 1905 and engaged in literary pursuits and lecturing.

Died in Chicago April 21, 1926.

OSCAR DePRIEST,

who was born March 9, 1871, went to Chicago in 1889 from his hometown in Alabama, and conducted a paint and decorating business until 1904.

He served as county commissioner in Cook County from 1894 to 1904 and served in the Chicago City Council from 1916 to 1917; served as commissioner under Mayor W. H. Thompson from 1912-22 and as alderman. He was a delegate to three Republican National Conventions and was a committeeman from Chicago's Third Ward.

In 1928, he was elected to Congress and served until 1934.

* * *

JOSEPH H. RAINEY
(1832-1887)

Born in Georgetown, S. C., June 21, 1832; received a limited education; member of the State Constitutional Convention of 1868; member of the State Senate in 1870, but resigned to fill unexpired term of B. F. Whitmore, white, U. S. Congressman. Served as a regular Republican member of Congress from South Carolina from December 12, 1870, to March 3, 1879, the longest term of any of the Reconstruction Congressmen.



He died in Georgetown, August 1, 1887.



ARTHUR W. MITCHELL

who was born December 22, 1883, present Representative from Chicago's First Illinois District, is the first Democrat of his race to be elected to Congress.

He taught school for many years in rural Alabama, founded Armstrong Agricultural School in West Butler, Ala., studied at Tuskegee, Columbia and Harvard and was admitted to the D. C. bar and practiced there ten years before moving to Chicago where he practiced from 1929 to 1934.

He was elected to Congress in 1935 and only last week announced that he would not be a candidate to succeed himself.

CHARLES E. NASH

Born in Opelousa, La., attended school in New Orleans. A bricklayer by trade, he fought as a private with the 88rd Regiment, U. S. Chasseurs d'Afrique. In 1863, he was promoted to sergeant-major. He lost a leg at the storming of Fort Blakely. Elected as a Republican to the Forty-fourth Congress and served from March 4, 1875, to March 3, 1877.

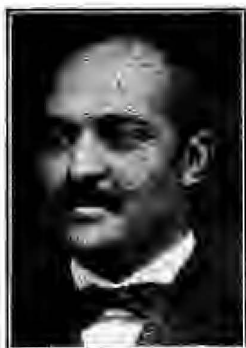
