

1) Interns

Help with planning and staging of a Reconciliation hearing; research on truth commissions, including experts to call as witnesses; line of questioning to develop recommendations; organize data from previous and future hearings. MC developed job description and spoke with Kristin in OAG → focus on county hearings but interns could help with Commission's work as a whole
