Debts of over \$887 due the estate including \$37.00 owed Cordery "for Board" and \$20.90 owed him for "a new ship built by Jas. Inloes".

"James Corderey died 7th April 1820"

The expenses of his illness and the support of his family until 2 August 1820 was paid through the rent of warehouse and wharf, the sale of a few items in the inventory above, the hire of other items such as the stage and kettle, and mostly by the labor of Harry, Charles, Abram, and Lydia, who were hired out. Harry and Charles were negro servants with five and four years (respectively) to serve. Abraham, or Abram, was a slave as was Lydia. The third slave of the family, Sophie, was not "hired out." Harry, Charles, and Abram worked at least once for Gardner and Robinson.
