



The revised version says, "Came mightily upon David," which makes the meaning more plain, as the Spirit must have been on him before. B comparing II Sam. ii., 4, and v., 3, with this verse we see that David was anointed three times. The full significance of this we shall see some day in Christ, the true David or Beloved. David, though anointed, waited long for the throne and suffered much. Our waiting for His throne and kingdom, and we must rejoice to wait and suffer with Him (II Tim. ii., 12; Bom. vili., 18).—Lesson Helper.
