John directs two disciples to Jesus (vs. 35-39). 35. "The next day." There were three days of testimony of John to Jesus: 1. To the deputation from the Sanhedrin (vs. 19-28). 2. Publicly, to the people (vs. 29-34). 3. Privately, to two disciples (vs. 35-37). "John stood." "Was standing." R. V. "Two of His disciples. Andrew (v. 40) and John, the author of this book, who modestly avoids using his

36. "And looking." John fixed his eyes upon Him, singling Him out and regarding Him with special attention. "Behold the Lamb of God." (The R.
