



C., and received the rudiments of his early education in the public schools of his home town. He has been a resident of Baltimore. some fifteen years or more. His connection with the Israel Baptist church. Baltimore, as a member for a number of years, was of the most pleasant and helpful nature. Being convinced of his call to the gospel ministry, Rev. Mr. Taylor made application to his church for license to preach.






