FOOD VALUE OF EGGS.

Eggs contain about 29 per cent of protein, about the same

as in cheese, average meat and fish and a little more than in peas and beans and nuts. For a man doing hard labor beans or chuck steak would be preferable to eggs as a source of proteln from the point of both physiological and household economy, although none of these is necessary, since corn or whole wheat bread contains sufficient protein. The egg is easily digested and combines fairly well with toast, which supplies the carbohydrate and bulk, but with meat, beans and most other foods the egg is incompatible and its retention in the stomach long beyond the period of its digestion often leads to serious results. The yolk contains a large percentage of fat, easily assimilated, with all the mineral elements. The diet of Cornaro, whose life was prolonged from 45, when physicians said he must die, to 102, was almost exclusively grape juice and uncooked eggs, compatible and easily digested. The popular notion about eggs is that they are good because they are nutritious, but whether they are good or bad depends largely on what other foods are taken with them


