Know How to Put It to Work. There are different ways of using a manure spreader. The best way is to set the machinery in such a way as to give the slowest possible speed to the apron. If set in this manner the beater gets two strokes at the manure, and the apron moving at a high speed it gets only one stroke. The more strokes the beater has at the same amount of manure the finer it will be. If operated


