Without her the cause of the Negro in this country would be lost."

It may be that the spirit of chivalry, which is still cultivated outside of the United States, had a lot to do with shaping this young man's opinion of his North American sisters. It may be also that a colored girl from Brazil or Guiana or Cuba would have conceived of her northern brother as the finest specimen of chivalric manhood and courtly grace, while his sister might be found to be dull and insipid.


