

Race Has Stood Enough of Ed Longer Accept an In Among Ameri

Bston, Mass., July 26-"We tell the citizens of this country right here and now that we, the colored residents of this country, will fight to death on the field of war, but will never consent to do one day of conscripted farm labor.' The foregoing emphatic utterance was made by William H. Lewis, speaking at the fifty-fourth anniversary of the charge made by Robert Gould' Shaw's men of the 54th Massachu setts Regiment at Fort Wagner, last

Mr. Lewis, who was "fired from his nost as Assistant Attorney General of has been regarded as a conser vative in his views, and his strong plea for a democracy that would include colored men was wild'y cheered.
