

life and highest interest. (b) A wider professional prospect a for the Negro teacher in connection in with his own day's work so the highar activities in connection therewith may be placed within the range of his possible attainment.

(c) A more specific dedication of the schools and colleges upkept by public funds to the work of educating | C the Negro broadly as an American citizen, and not narrowly as a Negro. (d) An impartial distribution of all federal funds in connection with state funds for the purpose of public education, both general and special; and more equitable apportionment of all public school funds to the schools for Negroes and a more careful supervision of them.
