On the 23 Oct. after Trafalgar Action Captured the Et. Reg. Spanish 1st Rate; afterwards assisted in the Capture and Destruction of a strong French Squadron at S. Domingo under the Command of Sir In the Duckworth, 6 February 1806; was afterwards employed in the Channel, assisted in destroying the Enemies Ships at the Mouth of the Charente; and Employed on the Coast of Portugal, and in Blockading Cherbourg; Commanded the Blockading Squadron before Cherbourg; Captain of the Channel Fleet under Lord Keith; and occasionally Commanding one of the Blockading Squadrons in the Channel.
