the 1st June 1814, then hoisted my Flag in the Royal Oak
and Proceeded with Troops from Bourdeaux to America
Employed in the Chesapeake, at New Orleans, and Mobile
until the conclusion of the War;

On Buonaparte returning to France was appointed Commander
in Chief of the Naval Force intended to Cooperate with the
Duke of Wellington and the allied armies, the conclusion
of this War, caused my Flag to be struck 25th Sept^r 1815.

in the Donegal in the Downs to command
the experimental Squadron throughout the
severe winters of 1832, & 1833 commanded
the combined British & French Fleet off the
coast of Holland
