At 9 the fog cleared away and the Batteries opened from our Lines about 1/2 past 9 the Enemy's Batteries opened and kept up a heavy Cannonade until Sunset - At 8 o'clock the Boat crews & small arm Seamen were ordered up to assist in withdrawing the guns from the Batteries a very heavy rain commenced about 30'clock and continued till midnight.
