to the Shipping or landing them on Cat Island - Some of the Enemy's Row boats made their appearance of the Rigolds, one of which was captured and her crew driven on Shore

Monday 23rd Westy

A.M. Fresh breezes & Cloudy W. Boats employed embarking the Second Brigade of the Army and carrying them down to the Shipping off Cat Island
P.M. Fresh breezes Boats employed as before

Tuesday 24th W. W. S.

A.M. Fresh breezes & Cloudy Boats employed embarking part of the Third Brigade of the Army and Baggage &c. and carrying them down to the Shipping off Cat Island or putting them on board of the small vessels

Wednesday 25th W. W. S.

A.M. Fresh breezes & fine Boats employed embarking the remainder of the Third Brigade of the Army & Baggage &c. and putting them on board small vessels on carrying them down to the Shipping off Cat Island

Thursday 26th W. W. S.

A.M. Moderate & fine - Collecting the Boats & small Craft to embark the First Brigade & every thing belonging to the Army
P.M. Boats arriving occasionally every thing ready for embarking the remainder of the Troops

Friday 27th S. S.

A.M. Moderate & fine weather
At 3 O'clock the First Brigade consisting of the 7th & 43rd Regts were embarked in the Boats & small vessels, every thing belonging to the Army and at 9 in the evening arrived off Cat Island where I went on board the Charlotte

Saturday 28th S. S. S.

A.M. Mod & hazy w. The whole of the Army were embarked on board the Shipping - Hoisted my Flag on board the Royal Oak off Ship Island

Sunday 29th S. S. S.

A.M. Mod: breezes & hazy. P.M. Mod: and cloudy. The Stantagant sailed for England

Monday 30th S. S. S.

A.M. Fresh breezes went to the Shipping us here to make the necessary arrangements
