In Testimony whereof to this Exemplification (the same being first duly
 sealed & stamped) I herewith set my hand and the seal of the County Court
 of Baltimore aforesaid this nineteenth day of February one thousand eight hundred and two.

And on the said day to wit the said second Tuesday of May in the year aforesaid
 came into the said General Court as well the said John and Margaret Hay by Nicholas
 Brier their attorney as the said Walter Conner by Hebulow Hollingsworth and John Pur-
 anee his attorney; And thereupon on motion of the said Walter Conner by his attorney
 aforesaid it was ruled by the said General Court that the said John and Margaret Hay assign
 the errors in the record of proceedings of the Judgment aforesaid brought before the said General
 Court for the correcting the errors supposed to be therein in Judgment by the said Court would
 be rendered against them in default thereof; Whereupon the said John and Margaret Hay
 by their attorney aforesaid prayed that a day might be given them for the assignment of
 errors of and upon the record of proceedings of the Judgment aforesaid until the second
 Tuesday of October then next and to them it was granted; the same day was given to
 the said Walter Conner also.

At which said second Tuesday of October being the twelfth day of the same month
 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two which said day was given
 to the said John and Margaret Hay for the assignment of errors of and upon the record of
 proceedings of the Judgment aforesaid came again into the said General Court as well the
 said John and Margaret Hay by their attorney aforesaid as the said Walter Conner by his
 attorney aforesaid; and the said John and Margaret Hay by their said attorney said that
 in the record of proceedings aforesaid and also in the giving of Judgment aforesaid there
 was manifest error in that point, that by the record of proceedings aforesaid it appeared
 that the Judgment aforesaid in the plea aforesaid given, was given for the said Walter Conner
 against the said John and Margaret Hay when by the law of the land that Judgment
 ought to have been given for the said John and Margaret Hay against the said Walter
 Conner, therefore in that there was manifest error and they prayed that the Judgment
 aforesaid for that error and other being in the record of proceedings might be reversed
 annulled and held entirely as void and that they the said John and Margaret Hay
 might be restored to all that they had lost by occasion of the said Judgment and
 that the said Walter Conner might rejoice to the errors aforesaid and of all, and the
 said Walter Conner by his attorney aforesaid said that there was no error in the record
 of proceedings aforesaid or in the rendition of the Judgment aforesaid and prayed that
