I beg submit the following opinion regarding the claim of Dour Sire Alexius J. Granger to the balance of the purchase money (\$208.60) from the sale of property No. 228 George Street for taxes. I have not investigated the facts carefully, but have prepared this opinion upon the assumption that the statement of facts submitted by Milton D. Greenbaum, Esq., attorney for Mr. Granger, is accurate, as I do not doubt it is. The facts appear to be the following: Mr. Granger was the owner of the ground rent of \$64.00 per wout of the aforemaid property. The leasehold title vested
