This two year term ran out on March 1, 1902. As I understand it, he was then re-appointed by Mayor Hayes to serve for three years from March 1, 1902. His present term will therefore expire on March 1, 1905. Mr. Yewell, the Commissioner for Opening Streets is, as I am 2280 informed, in the same situation as Judge Sams.
