Gentlemen:-

I have had a conference with the Superintendent of Lamps and Lighting and the City Solicitor with reference to the correspondence which has taken place between the Consolidated Gas Company and Mr. McCuen, with respect to your charge for excess of gas supplied to the City lamps.

I am advised by the City Solicitor that, in his opinion, the only way in which this excess can be lawfully ascertained is that pointed out by Sections 541 and 542 of the City Charter.

This conclusion would seem to be the more sound in view of the fact that this is the mode by which consumption of gas has always heretofore been fixed.
