Dear Sir:-

Por, at least, two years this Department has at intervals attempted to abate a nuisance on Liberty Road in Forest Park, opposite, or nearly opposite, to Callaway Ave. This nuisance consists in an accumulation of waste water from the kitchensand bathrooms of houses situated on the West side of Liberty Road. These houses are situated on ground that drains eastward towards Williams' Run. If it were not for the rail-road and the new Liberty Road, the drainage from the houses, above referred to, would flow down hill to Williams' Run, or would flow into the graded Callaway Ave.

I understand that the tenants of the houses referred to are willing to bear all expense in piping the waste water under the trolley
line at Liberty Road in order to convey it into the gutter on Callaway
Ave. But as far as I know Callaway Ave. is private property, and, therefore
