I am in receipt of your favor of the 24th inst. I have earefully considered the provisions of Chapter 333 of the Acts of the
General Assembly of Maryland of the year 1902, referred to by you, and
also the provisions of ordinance No. 86, approved October 14, 1902,
which was passed by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore pursuant
to the Act of Assembly.

In my opinion the legislation above mentioned is broad enough to authorize the expenditure of the sum of \$25,000.00 for the purposes specified by you, provided that an ordinance is passed by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, appropriating the amount out of the loan authorized by the legislation above mentioned. The appropriation, when made by the City Council, would become a part of the third list which would be prepared by the Board of Estimates for the Ordinance of Estimates for the year 1906. It could not, therefore, be availed of until January 1st 1906.
