3880 Referring to the letters of the 3d. and 4th. inst. from the City Engineer to the Commissioners, in reference to the old culvert under the York Road, at the Engine House, near Thirty-first Street, which letters were handed to me this morning by Mr. Smith and are herewith returned, I beg leave to say that I see no reason why the reconstruction of the culvert should not be effected by the City Engineer, under the supervision of the Commissioners for Opening Streets; the cost to be defrayed out of its loan.

3881 As the work will be done by a municipal official, Sections 14 and 15 of the City Charter, in regard to the awarding of contracts, would have no application.
