OPINION.

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to construct a sewer in the bed of Patterson street, south of Eastern Avenue, to Canton Avenue, and thence to Tidewater, and that the grantors were the owners of the street, conveyed to the City, in consideration of \$1233.83 and of the covenant hereinafter mentioned on the part of the City, the part of Patapsco street between Eastern and Canton Avenues, as a public street, and the City covenanted that it would, at its sole cost and charge, grade, pave and curb Patapsco street, from Eastern Avenue to the south side of Canton Avenue, and that no part of the cost should be assessed upon the property then owned by the grantors between Eastern Avenue and Canton Avenue.

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A similar deed was subsequently accepted from Laura Patterson, trustee, and others, the same being recorded in Liber J. B. Number 1284, folio 133 etc. Said last mentioned deed contains a covenant to the same effect as the deed from James Wilson Patterson, et al., to the City above mentioned.
