In reply to your favor of January 16th, 1907, with which you enclosed a letter from the City Engineer relating to Main avenue, I beg to report that the ordinance referred to by the City Engineer provides for acceptance of a deed for the absolute and unconditional conveyance in fee simple of the bed of Main avenue from the New Liberty Road to the western-city limits, after the grading, curbing, guttering and sidewalk work, which certain persons were doing at the time of the passage of the ordinance, have been completed at the expense of the persons or corporation doing same, and after approval of said work by the City Engineer.

I have never been requested to advise the City Engineer and have not been advised that the prerequisites have been complied with; moreover, part of the aforesaid street is subject to easement of the Gas Company, as reported to you in a letter of even date herewith.
