Gentlemen:-

Referring to the matter of tunneling on the Sunwalt Run
(96") Drain.

I call your attention to page 26, of Storm-Water Contract
No. 2, under "Excavation", in which you will see that no excavation
shall be made in tunnel without the consent of the engineer. If you
wish to make this excavation in tunnel you will have to present a
written request therefor to the Chief Engineer.

Mr. Hendrick further says that there is no provision in the
Storm-Water specifications under "Tunneling" permitting the payment
for timber and for extra concrete, as requested by you.
