A Mrs. Joy, living at 2214 McCulloch Street, keeps on her premises twenty-three dogs and some twelve or fourteen cats.

These animals are not only a nuisance, but a danger to health, having caused the illness of my father, Mr. W. L. Bourne.

We have taken this matter up on different occasions with Dr. Bosley during the last two years, and on Tuesday last, notice was served on Mrs. Joy to remove these dogs within seven days.

Dr. Bosley claims that she has removed ten of the dogs, and still has thirteen on the premises. He also says that he has the power
