Dear Madam:-

Your letter of the 15th inst., to hand. Assuming the  
 situation to be what you state it to be, and I have no reason to  
 think that you exaggerate it, it is a very serious one indeed. If  
 it is serious enough to affect the comfort of the public generally,  
 you should apply to the State's Attorney. If it does not affect the  
 comfort of the public generally, but ~~only~~ affects your perso-  
 nal comfort, you could, perhaps, bring an action for damages, or sue  
 out an injunction. Dr. Bosley cannot interfere unless the nuisance  
 is of a nature, in his opinion, to affect the public health. This is  
 a question for him, not for me.
