I reply to your Secretary's communication of the 2nd instant, in relation to the bill of Messrs. Wyatt and Nolting, architects, for \$1,000, for an unsuccessful competitive design submitted by them, in connection with the erection of the Municipal Infectious Disease Hospital. Ordinance No. 9, approved Sept. 20, 1905, authorized the Hospital Commission to "employ an architect to make such drawings and specifications for a building or buildings, as the Commissioners should determine upon, as being needed", and appropriated the sum of \$2,500 "to defray the costs of erecting said buildings and such other expenses as might be incurred under the provisions of the ordinance."
