Replying to your letter of the 7th instant, I beg leave to say that, Under the provisions of Ordinance No. 157, approved November 29th, 1904, any surplus in the hands of the Centre Market Commission can be used for the purpose of erecting stalls in the Retail market. The purchase of all furniture and equipments for the new Centre Market, however, is required by the terms of the Ordinance to be made by the Commission, and not by the Comptroller, or any other municipal official.
