The Commissioners asked you to advise them what course they should pursue, with reference to these matters, if you should be of the opinion, that the required notice was not given. It appears to me, that they should notify the contractors, before the work of paving is undertaken, of the fact, that the required notice was not given, and that the paving when commenced may be stopped by legal proceedings. If, with full knowledge of the facts, the contractors are willing to undertake the paving, I do not see how the City's interests will suffer.
