By Section 37 of the Charter as amended by the Acts of 1906, Chapter 357, the right to use the streets of the City for any private purpose not prohibited by law and not being a franchise or right requiring a formal grant by ordinance may be granted by the Board for such an amount of money and upon such terms as the said Board may consider right and proper. I find no law or ordinance prohibiting the placing of chewing gum slots on the sidewalks of the City. Therefore, in my opinion, the Board of Estimates has the power, if it sees fit, subject to the restrictions of Section 37 of the Charter to grant to Mr. W. F. Landis, No. 925 Calvert Building, City, the minor privilege which he asks for.
