vision is placed with the Sewerage Commission, which was done under the impression that Section 2, paragraph 3, "Constructing Sewers, Buildings, Plants, etc", gave the Sewerage Commission this power. I beg to quote from a letter received from Mr. Preston today, as follows:-

"As the supervision of the proposed Pumping Station is to be under the Inspector of Buildings, the specifications should be changed so that the drawings may be seen at this office; and no other persons than the Inspector of Buildings or those designated by him shall direct the work. This applies to the substructure and also to the superstructure, wherever they put the Engineer or Architect in control."

Do I understand that I must change the wording of the specifications as approved by you and place the entire work in the control of the Inspector of Buildings?
